 **Wednesday, Nov 2/Day 1**
North Dakota to Duluth, MN

Duluth to Mackinaw City, MI

 **Friday, Nov 4/Day 3**
Mackinaw City to Frankenmuth

Frankenmuth is one of the three main early American Lutheran settlements that eventually come together to form the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod. Rev. Frederick Wyneken, a traveling pastor in Indiana and Michigan, requested from the Bavarian pastor, Wilhelm Loehe, to send help to the Frankenmuth area to do missionary work among the Native Americans. By December 1846, a church-school-parsonage was dedicated, named St. Lorenz. St. Lorenz became one of the 14 charter congregations of the Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, and now consists of over 4,900 members. Today we will tour this magnificent church and hear the majestic pipe organ.

Frankenmuth, MI to
Fort Wayne, IN

Concordia University Ann Arbor, MI is one of many universities in the Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod. While all of our Concordia Universities train men and women for service in the Church, Ann Arbor, along with our other Concordias, have become Lutheran liberal arts schools, which offer a wide array of specialties. Overlook-

ing the Huron River, CUAA has been on this site since 1963. While in Ann Arbor, Rev. David Maier, district president of the Michigan District LCMS will host us for a special afternoon.

Upon our arrival in Fort Wayne, we will be treated to a **pasta buffet at B. Antonio's** where they have combined their love for serving people with their expertise in the restaurant industry. (CB, D)

 **Sunday, Nov 6/Day 5**
Fort Wayne

Historic St. Paul's Lutheran Church is the oldest Missouri Synod Church in Indiana, having been established in 1839. Today we will worship in this magnificent cathedral-like structure, which was erected in 1889. Prolific writer of Lutheran music, Kevin Hildebrand, will be the organist for the day. St. Paul's adult choir will be singing as well. Like St. Lorenz, St. Paul's is also one of the 14 charter congregations of the Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod.

Our experience at Concordia Theological Seminary will begin with a **brunch** that is an absolute feast! CTS started out with a 1953 decision to start a Senior College for pre seminary students in the Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod. The internationally famous architect Eero Saarinen and his associates, who also designed the St. Louis arch, designed the entire campus, consisting of a total of 25 college buildings plus faculty housing.

While at the seminary, we will be treated to a campus tour and a riveting historical presentation by Dr. Lawrence Rast. Rast is one of our Synod's finest historians and shares this knowledge with great enthusiasm. The highlight of our Seminary visit will be the All Saint's Day Choral Vespers with an astounding choir, orchestra, and organ. It will be absolutely breathtaking in the gorgeous acoustically-rich seminary chapel. A **formal reception** will follow the Vespers Service. (CB, L, D)
